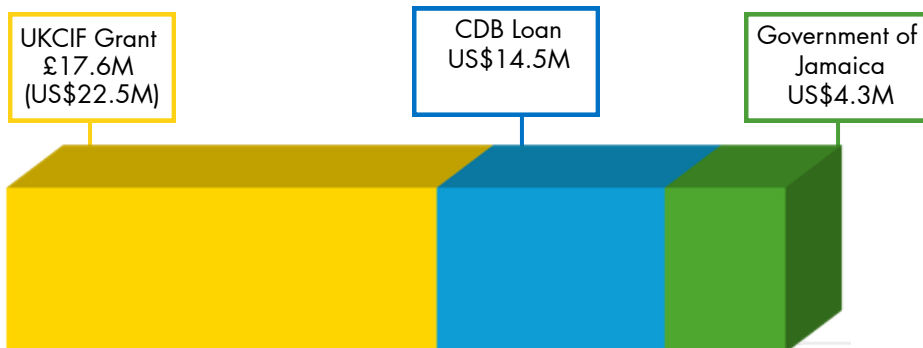
PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Benefits for over 700 Farmers and Stakeholders including Women and Youth
- Construction Completion - June 2028

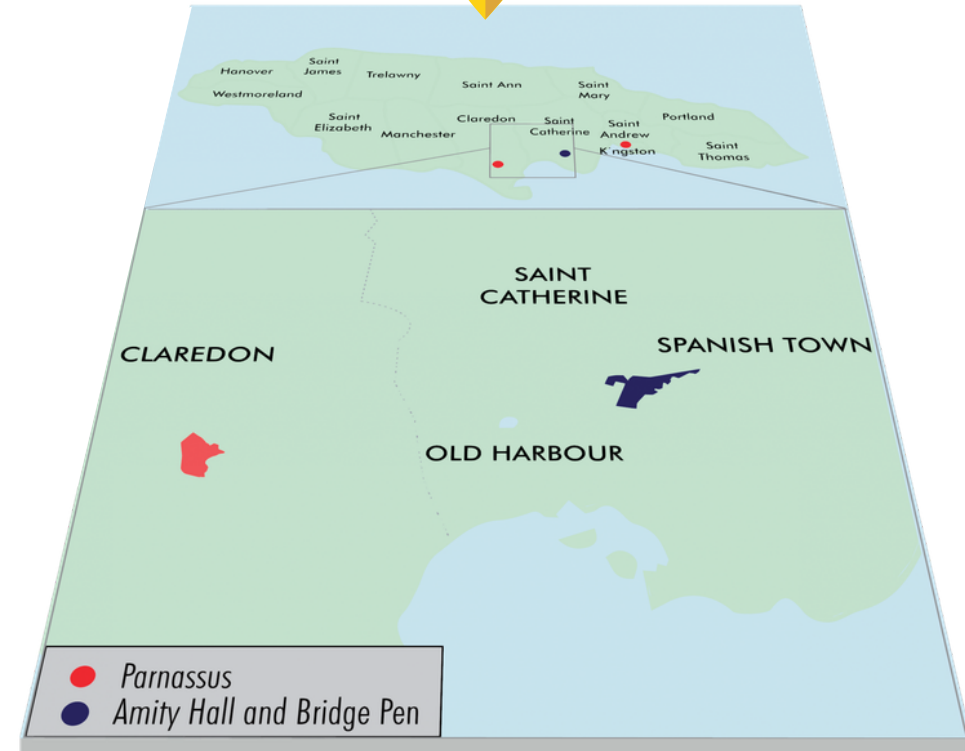
