Project Summary

Project Outcome/Description:

The expected outcome of the Project is improved access to enhanced and inclusive agricultural production systems in the Nord-ouest (North West Department) of Haiti.

The Project components are:

- 1. **Enhanced Agricultural Systems:** This component will co-finance a menu of demand-driven subprojects. Sub-projects are likely to include:
 - (a) upgrading of existing and construction of new irrigation infrastructure;
 - (b) rehabilitation/upgrading of watersheds linked to irrigations systems/arable land;
 - (c) capacity building and technical assistance to male and female farmers and farmer groups linked to new and existing irrigation schemes/ production centres;
 - (d) upgrading of existing, and construction/purchase of new critical infrastructure and equipment in support of production, transport, storage and marketing of crops; and
 - (e) monitoring and evaluation (M&E).

2. **Project Management.**

Exceptions to CDB Policies:

A waiver of CDB's Guidelines for Procurement (2006), is requested to permit procurement of four vehicles with no restriction as to country eligibility with respect to the origin of the vehicle, and for the use of shopping as the method of procurement. The waiver will enable GOH to purchase vehicles at the most competitive rates as it will ensure the participation of all local suppliers and vehicle dealerships, whose vehicles may have their origin in a non-CDB member country. Additionally, the ability to purchase the vehicles locally will improve access to spare parts and maintenance services and contribute to the sustainability of the assets. Shopping is deemed to be the most appropriate procurement method.
