







Western Road Corridor Upgrade

This project engaged consulting services to prepare feasibility study and detailed designs for improving climate resilience and safety along 26 km of Grenada's Western Road Corridor from the capital, St. George's to the village of Victoria in St. Mark; a Road Safety Assessment; and an Institutional Capacity Assessment and Preliminary Capacity Building Programme to support the Executing Agency. The expected outcome is improved decisionmaking on the design and resources for a capital project developed based on these outputs.
