

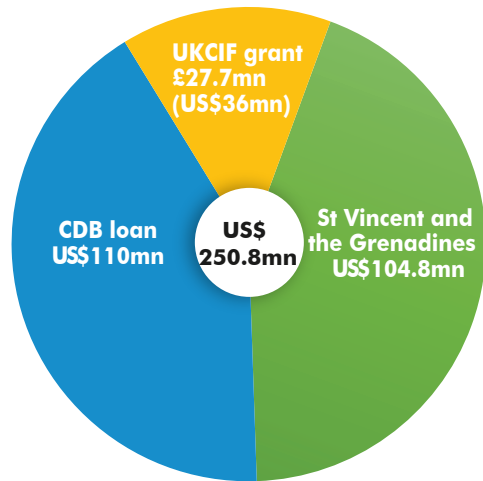


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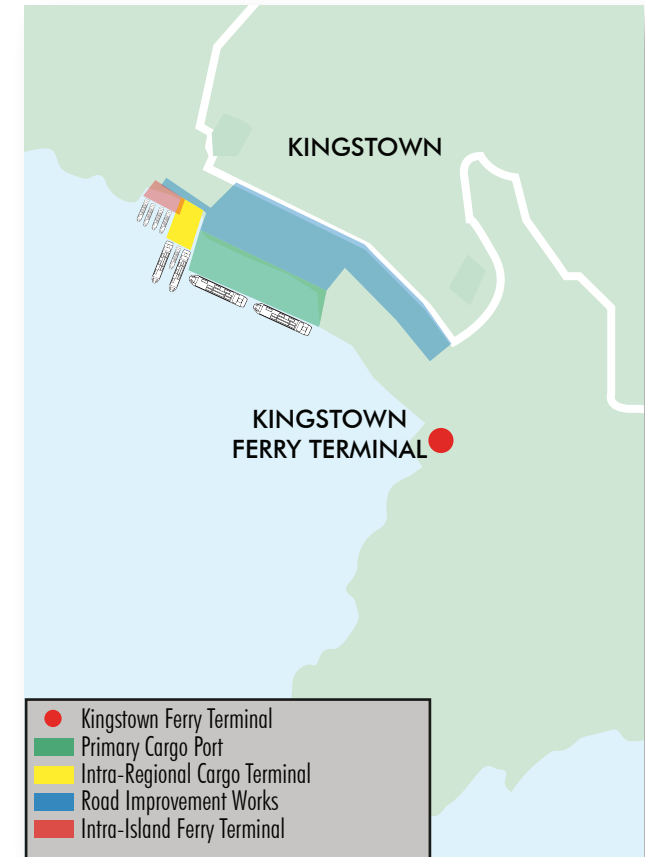
Kingstown Port Modernisation

This project will construct new cargo port facilities and associated access roads on reclaimed land near the existing Kingstown Harbour, providing essential climate resilient infrastructure for economic activity on the island. A new marine sewer line will protect and improve the sustainability of the surrounding marine environment. The project will increase the efficiency of port services, and facilitate economic growth, while protecting the marine environment and providing livelihood support for project-affected persons.



110,000 residents

will benefit from improved access to modern and efficient port services, which will facilitate better access to goods and services and greater economic opportunities.
