Project Outcome/Description:

The objective of the project is enhanced capacity of OC to increase enrolment and provide quality tertiary education and training in St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Grenadines. The project will also upgrade skills for employability, consistent with national and regional development imperatives.

The project components are:

(a) Enhancing the Learning Environment:

(i) expansion and rehabilitation of the St. Lucia and St. Vincent and the Grenadines Open Campus Country Sites (OCCS); and (ii) preparation of Maintenance Plans for these OCCSs.

(b) Improved Technology Capacity for Service Delivery:

- (i) upgrade of OCCSs technology systems, connectivity and equipment; and
- (ii) preparation of an implementation framework for the Single Virtual University Space (SVUS) project.

(c) Improved relevance of training:

Development of demand-driven, gender and environmentally sensitive $^{1/}\,$ programmes/courses.
