



CAVE HILL: OFFICIAL GATEWAY TO CHINA

Cave Hill Campus continues to play a pivotal role in bringing China closer to Barbados and the rest of the region. Its oneyear-old Confucius Institute (CI) has gained approval as a Caribbean Hanyū Shuiping Kaoshi (HSK) - Chinese proficiency testing centre for Mandarin.

Approval means that the Campus through its Centurius Institute will be allowed to award students internationally recognized cartification in Chinese.


